Orchids of Crete

We are pleased to have **Ron Parsons** as our speaker and are looking forward to seeing his wonderful slides from his visit to Crete.

Ron Parsons is considered by many to be one of the finest flower photographers in the United States. His photography and encyclopedic knowledge of orchids is known both nationally and internationally. He has been photographing orchids, wildflowers, and almost every other kind of plant for over 25 years, and has a slide collection that numbers well over 80,000 slides! Ron loves to travel, photograph orchids and wildflowers in situ, visit orchid and other plant enthusiasts collections, and most of all, to take photographs of plants and flowers that he likes. Ron's photos have been featured in journal articles, book covers and in many different books. His photography was recently featured in two books that he coauthored: Masdevallias, Gems of the Orchid World (by Mary Gerritsen and Ron Parsons. Timber Press 2005); and Calochortus: Mariposa Lilies and Their Relatives (Mary Gerritsen and Ron Parsons, Timber Press 2007). Ron and Mary are now working on a

third book, Rare and Unusual Orchid Species. Of course, to feature rare and unusual orchid species requires lots of field research, and one of Ron's field trips is the subject of this lecture.

Crete, the largest of the Greek islands, is situated in the eastern Mediterranean Sea. This beautiful island is approximately 250 kilometers long and 56 kilometers wide at most and only 12 kms wide at its narrowest point. The island is like a giant rock garden, with many beautiful plants (and far too many goats!) growing in its stony soils. Many of these are endemic to the island. Where the orchids are found, they can be very numerous in both species and quantity. There are more than 60 species of orchids here, many of them very variable, several with regional subspecies. There are lots of natural hybrids also, making identification difficult. This talk features the orchids (as well as some of the other beautiful wildflowers) seen on a trip there in the middle of April, 2007.

Know your Board

Getting to know the new Board and Officers of POS

Mary Gerritsen, President. Mary has been growing orchids on and off for over 20 years, although she has been seriously addicted for only the last ten (since joining the POS in 1997). Her collection numbers well over 1000 plants and is a mixture of different species and hybrids, grown in one very small greenhouse, all over Mary's house (and office at work), and in three outdoor lath structures. Her favorites are Masdevallias, Bulbophyllums and Dendrobiums. In recent years, Mary discovered a new hobby, writing books. With her co-author and photographer (and fellow POS member) Ron Parsons, Mary now has two published books: Masdevallias, Gems of the Orchid World, and Calochortus, Mariposa Lilies and their relatives. Mary and Ron are now working on their third book "Rare and Unusual Orchids of the World". Mary has visited Ecuador, Peru, Costa Rica, Panama, Mexico and Australia to see orchids in situ and hopes to visit more localities in the near future. In addition, she has seen many of the California terrestrial orchids in their native habitats. Mary's goals for the POS for 2008: to encourage new members to get involved with POS activities and board functions and to finally get the POS 501C3 status. When Mary is not growing orchids or writing about them, she works in the biotech industry discovering new drugs for cancer.

Mike Rector, Vice President. Mike has been growing orchids with his wife Janet for about 20 years. Thanks to the POS they now have a better idea about how to accomplish this. They have a small greenhouse full of a variety of warm growing orchids and recently have expanded to Bulbohphyllums and are having some luck. They especially enjoy Cattleya and Vanda orchids. Mike and Jan have been members of the POS for some years and have enjoyed all of the lessons and then lessons learned in the greenhouse. Mike's goal for the POS for 2008 is to have the society a benefit to all that attend. Mike works as an international telecom consultant.

Dennis Olivas, Past President, and Board Member. Dennis will serve as an advisor to the elected officers and board members. He has been growing orchids for more than 45 years, and likes to grow almost everything, although he loves species just a little better than hybrids. His favorites are *Laelia purpurata* and *Laelia anceps*. Dennis grows an uncountable number of

orchids, somewhere between 8000 and 10,000, although he is not really sure! Most are grown in his unheated 3000 sq foot greenhouse in Half Moon Bay and thus his growing philosophy is "survival of the fittest!". He has been a member of the POS since 1987. Dennis works as a Senior Information Management Specialist, working in a corporate library.

Fred Shull, Board Member. Fred has been a member of POS for over 25 years and enjoyed every year. He has been growing orchids for about 45 years with several hundred (or thousand) orchid plants. Fred has always thought of POS as being the best Orchid Society in the Bay Area. Interesting speakers, always a great display table but most of all are the friendly members who make all members feel welcomed. Refreshments too are always good. Fred describes himself as an "out-of-control" hobbyist. His main area of interest is in the Cattleya alliance. Fred has been fortunate to visit Brazil on many different occasions to view orchid expositions and to see orchids growing in their natural habitat. Fred hopes we can continue working together, encouraging and recruiting new members, to keep POS as the outstanding and friendly orchid society.

Scott Dallas, Board Member. Scott joined the POS about 28 years ago, initially to learn more about orchids. He now has a collection of thousands of orchids, and is the owner of White Oak Orchids (Pacifica, CA). He likes to grow many different types of orchids, and has cool, intermediate and warm growing species and hybrids in his collection. He has traveled to Mexico and parts of the US to see orchids in situ. Scott's specific objective as a member of the board is to educate the membership about the realities of the business of orchids. When he is not caring for his orchids, he likes to sleep (don't we all!), listen to music, and watch movies.

Sue Rose, Treasurer. Sue has been growing orchids for about 5 years, and has been a member of the POS for the same length of time. She has about 160 orchids, and one small greenhouse, with a new one on the way this spring. Her goal is to get new people to join the board this year and to come up with new ideas to stimulate membership and participation. She is the grandmother of 6 (soon to be 7) and this year her family has also grown with the addition of Kosmo, her new dog. Lucky for the POS, she is a retired business systems manager with a background in accounting.

Ken Jacobsen is a new director on the POS board, and has been a member of POS for 7 or 8 years, and has been growing orchids for almost 40 years. He had been looking for a good orchid society for some years, and when he visited the POS show and a meeting years ago, it seemed the perfect match. With his wife Amy, Ken has over 5000 orchids. Although many people think of him as a 'Cymbidium person' (and he does have nearly 3000 cymbidiums), together with Amy he also grows Cattleyas, Laelias, Odontoglossums, Oncidiums, Lycastes, Masdevallias, Stanhopeas, Vandas, and other genera. Ken and Amy have found that visiting orchids in their native habitat often leads to better culture and growing success. They've made several trips to see orchids in the wild, including rupiculous Laelias in the province of Minas Gerais, Brazil, and Sophronitis several hours from Sao Paulo, Brazil. Several other South American locations are in their future travel plans. Ken was formerly an executive in a couple of Silicon Valley firms and is now trying to start his own venture with special imaging software. Some day, this software might even be applied to orchids!

Jocelyn Jamias is returning for her 3rd year as Corresponding Secretary. A member since 2006, Jocelyn has a small orchid collection living in her dining room, kitchen window and covered patio. She currently has approximately 100 orchids which will triple in number this spring when she finally divides and repots all those cymbidiums! She grows mostly Cymbidiums, Dendrobiums, Oncidiums and Phalaenopsis--although her favorite orchid is the Maxillaria

tenuifolia (coconut orchid). As a member of the Board, her goal is directed towards the bottom line--increasing both our membership and cash reserves so as to continue to provide our society members with the high quality speakers and events they have become accustomed to in the last few years. When she is not busy watering and fertilizing (weekly, weakly), Jocelyn likes to work out at the gym 6 days a week, read books and knit. She also manages to fit in a full time job in Commercial Real Estate Sales for NAI BT Commercial in Palo Alto.

Su McMurtry has served various functions for the POS over the last 15 years. This is the first time she has served as membership chair. Su been growing orchids for about 20 years, and over the years have changed her love from the really warm growers to a more cool crowd. She still loves the tiny little species, but finds the most success these days with paphs and their cousins. She now grows her orchids in Belmont in her dad's greenhouse. Su visits her orchids once a week, and they have to be hardy to go without daily visits.

Rebecca Grubbs, Recording Secretary and Refreshment Chairperson with Olga Ostrovsky. Rebecca has been growing/killing orchids for the past 3 years. She takes a little comfort from Rory Nakata's comment that you may kill about 500+ orchids before you learn enough to be good at growing them. Rebecca grows her orchids in the house and covered patio. Because she lives in Half Moon Bay, cool growing orchids may become her favorite. She has been a member of POS for 2 years. Rebecca works for Mills High School as a teacher and teacher aide in special education.

Chaunie Langland has experience writing technical reports and horse show programs. This was close enough to get her the job of newsletter editor. (Um, maybe the competition wasn't too fierce.) Chaunie came to the 199? POS show at her mother-in-law's invitation and was instantly assimilated into the POS via the force of the members' cheerful personalities and enthusiasm for orchids. She now has a 6'x8 ' greenhouse, in her backyard in Fremont, which she struggles to keep under 100° F much of the year. Her main focus is phrags, but she loves to win plants from the opportunity table to try new varieties and is easily infatuated with almost anything in bloom. Chaunie spends her weekdays doing materials analysis for a hard drive company using ESCA, AES, and SEM. (You don't want to know. Really.)
