President's Corner

Over the past few months we've seen our spring blooming orchids at their best, and we've had a chance to enjoy their flowers to the fullest. We also were given a special chance at our last meeting to learn more about how the AOS judges flowers, and hopefully we all learned more about what makes some plants a little more special than others.

Now that the spring bloomers are finishing their display, it's the perfect time to start thinking about next year, and how to get the most from each plant the next time it blooms. For those plants you noted this year as being especially nice, it isn't too early to think about giving them special care, so perhaps they'll find their way into our society show in January or into shows for other societies, depending on the time of bloom.

One way to ensure your special plants are in top condition for next year is to take care of any reporting needs as early this year as possible. Each plant should be examined to see if the media is degraded, or if the plant is too large for its current container. If either is true, reporting is needed. If the roots of the plant are in active growth and the new roots aren't in danger of serious damage during reporting, now is the best time to do this chore.

Of course, repotting of each genus is somewhat different. Some genera are very forgiving while other genera can be very particular. The trick is knowing which genera are forgiving, and which are not. The good news is that this month the POS is having a repotting clinic for our monthly meeting, and experts in different genera will be at the clinic to assist in repotting member plants, and to provide advice. It isn't often one has the chance to have help from the likes of Anna Chai, Dan Newman, Amy Chung, Gerardus Staal and Tom Mudge for repotting plants, so everyone should take advantage of this opportunity. While working on the repotting, you can probably also ask in a one-on-one to few-on-one environment about some of the experts growing techniques.

Editor's corner

After I decided not to buy a greenhouse, I ordered a Wardian case. Of course, before it even arrived a friend found a greenhouse kit for me on Craig's list and I had the greenhouse before the Wardian case arrived. Well, the Wardian case was certainly easier to bring from box to housing orchids!



However, not everything does well in the Wardian case, and being a focal point in my family room, it seems like it would be nice to have several flowering plants in there at all times. Last year I found that Dend. cuthbertsonii did very well in there - with bright flowers and almost constantly in bloom these were a great addition. Then Mary Gerritsen gave her talk on Masdevallias last November and supplied the opportunity table. I was lucky enough to win several plants. Mary helped me pick out non-Masdevallias - Restripia antennifera, Pleurothallis niveoglobula, and Pleurothallis amparoana (photo left)- since I have not done well getting Masdevallias to bloom for me in Fremont. (One flower on a plant is cause for major celebration.)

We often have a slew of small orchids with cute flowers for the Show & Tell table. While I admired these small flowers, I often times have found the combination of the number of plants and my limited time to spend examining them have not left me with the proper appreciation for them. Now that I have a few in the Wardian case, I finally "get it". Many of these little guys, are blooming constantly - with very interesting flowers. No wonder there are so many to bring in. While they would be hard to spot in my greenhouse, they are wonderful in the Wardian case.

On April 4th I visited a member greenhouse (Fred Shull's) and two small sales; one at Paul Chim's place in San Leandro and one at Paula Shiu's place in Richmond. It is interesting to see how the bigger and more advanced growing spaces are set up. This was also one of my first visits to these types of sales.

When I got to Paul and Phyllis Chim's I found one beautiful plant marked \$999. Being a very casual cymbidium grower (my small collection is full of untagged plants) I wondered if cymbidiums were like Neofinetias - with prices routinely in the stratosphere. However, I learned that Paul actually did not want to sell this, one of his favorite plants, but only had it out for display.

Paula Shiu had a lot of wonderful cymbidiums - roped off to keep us from trying to make off with her best plants. I ended up buying some very nicely priced seedlings of snap beans, coreopsis, sweet peas and layia platyglossa from her.

I learned that it is not so easy to find orchids that these orchid enthusiasts are willing to part with. But, they do display some of their best plants in bloom that I otherwise would not have had an opportunity to see. I would recommend making some outings to these yearly sales just to see some really nice orchids.

Lastly, my apologies, but most of the orchid photos in this issue are not labeled. Because we had the judging at our March meeting, many of the tags on the Show & Tell table were folded, and time was limited. I was also not inclined to pull tags out of plants when I visited greenhouses on April 4th.

For every \$25 you spend, we will have you enter your society of choice for a raffle plant table. Last fall sale, the Napa Valley Orchid Society won this prize.


