Speaker - Weegie Caughlan

A leisurely walk through the Cymbidium entries at the major shows in Northern California as seen through the eyes of a judge.

For those with an eye on the Cymbidium World, Weegie Caughlan needs no introduction. She is known not only in California and the US, but world wide as one of the best amateur growers and exhibitors of the Cymbidium genus. She has won many local Best in Show awards as well as her fifth Grand Champion award this year at the prestigious Santa Barbara International Orchid Show. In 2000, she retired the Elm Estate Trophy given at POE after winning it for 10 years. Adding to this the many AOS and CSA awards over the years, some of them on her own crosses, shows Weegie not only exhibits a keen eye for quality but is truly a grower "par excellance". Her expertise and success in designing award winning orchid displays is also well documented.

Weegie started as a teenager many years ago by tending her mother's orchid collection as a way to earn extra spending money. After her parents' deaths, she returned to her childhood home and again took over what remained of the Cymbidium collection. Love of the remaining species quickly turned to passion and the rest is history.

Weegie is currently the President of the Gold Coast Cymbidium Growers' Branch of the Cymbidium Society of America (CSA) s for the second time. She is a past President of POS and the Malihini Orchid Society and a founding member of both the CSA branches in the bay area. She has been an accredited judge with the AOS for fifteen years. She claims to be slowing down and exhibiting less, but few have seen real evidence of it yet!

Skill Session: Weegie will give this month's skill session on Cymbidium Culture and show preparation.

Opportunity Table: A fantastic table will be supplied by Weegie. She says, "The plant table will be composed of divisions of my plants, many awarded, as well as some new seedlings. It is too early for anything in bloom but I hope I can find some showing spikes.

Editor's corner

Look before you pluck!

It's not uncommon to find extra water loving plants living in pots and baskets with my orchids in the greenhouse. When I have time, I pluck the ferns and other assorted unauthorized competitors out of their perches. Last month I was cleaning out the basket that holds a Miltonia spectabilis . It had ferns and several other plants growing happily in the green moss (not sphagnum moss). As I grabbed one plant, I felt a surprising, but unfortunately not unknown, pain. There was stinging nettle growing in among the other pests! I will look more closely in the future.



In other surprising news, I actually got around to repotting a few desperate plants this month. (That is the surprising part.) A multi-growth Maudiae type paphiopedilum, potted in a 3 inch pot, had a couple of growths with the wrinkling of the leaves typical of sub-optimal amounts of watering. While I don't repot often, I do water like a fiend. When I pulled the plant out of it's pot, I discovered that the roots were only an inch long. The plastic pot had been designed with ventilation slits around the bottom two inches of the pot and the roots had stopped just above the ventilation slits. So much for my

theory that any person I buy an orchid from has superior potting techniques that should not be disturbed until absolutely necessary.

The Show Must Go Off

One thing the Peninsula Orchid Society could count on, is the gregarious nature of orchid enthusiasts. In its varied past, the Society has been the sponsor of annual banquets, greenhouse visits, potlucks, open houses and bingo nights, all serving the purposes of mixing our members and providing them with occasions to talk. And talk together we have. And eat. And share a plant, or a growing technique, or a joke.

The Society has evolved slowly, along the lines of its membership. Orchid growing is no longer a fancy pastime for "professional men," as was stated in a 1930s catalog for the L. Sherman Adams orchid nursery. Nor is it the unique preserve of chatty wives, as it might have struck a visitor to our meetings in the 1950s. One incidental benefit from the ubiquity of orchids at big box retailers is that, at entry level at least, orchids are accessible now to all, and so is Peninsula Orchid Society.

Our programs have also evolved. No longer do we play bingo in August, or eat rubber chicken in January, or set up a stand to perform reporting for the public in the springtime. Our Board is ever vigilant to test the interest of our members in what the Society does and, if that interest fails, the programs will reflect it.

The auction remains a most popular social activity and is a service the Society performs. We provide a time and place when members and any of the public can exchange plants through the medium of bidding. That time is next month, and it is not too soon to look over your plans to decide what plant you can spare, what you cannot do justice to, and what will not perform within the limits of your growing conditions. If these plants are healthy, clean and desirable, they are plants for the POS Auction! Our website will soon have posted auction entry forms that you may fill in and submit electronically. We encourage all auction entries to be made ahead of the auction date. Because the auction is so popular, we must limit the number of entries from each member.

Another most popular activity is the Annual Show and Sale. Since 1997, this has become a social event extending over three days, with continuous food and beverage service for all volunteers (and who wasn't one?) and vendors, judges and the many spouses pressed into service. Add the all-day plant selling, the four or five growing seminars daily, the raffles and judging and what we have had is really a three-day-long orchid-themed party. Our member Rene Biggs had made this possible, serving as senior co-chair and chief balloon-filler for almost all of the past 14 years. But Rene no longer is able to make the show happen "as if by magic" - which has forced the POS Board members to think hard and unhappy thoughts about the scope of the show.

It has not been possible to identify a member who will serve as chair of the show for 2011, let alone two persons to serve as co-chairs. In my last column here, I described the issues: it seems everyone has something to do during December planning time; the nation has NFL to compete for attention during January weekends; rain inevitably falls on some part of the parade. We proposed moving the show to late spring to solve these. The few who spoke up, objected to a change of date, but no one volunteered to make it happen in January. Our Board has now proposed a reduction in the non-orchid expenses, food and refreshments which would much simplify the management of the show, but without a doubt there will be equal objection to those changes too. And still no one to chair the show.

Because of the manifest lack of interest in management of the show in January 2011, the Board at its meeting last week decided to suspend the show and its planning. We have booked the January date but will not pay for the show space when it is due; we have not requested AOS or CSA judges for the show date. POS is ever-evolving. The Board affirms its commitment to the program of monthly meetings, the Annual Auction, and the bus tour, but without a chair, The Show Must Go Off!
