Below are descriptions of what jobs we need to have done before, during, and after the show.

**SET UP:** Set up is Friday, January 24th. We will be setting up the display and sales areas. The tables need to be covered with plastic covers and skirting and the lighting must be set up. We also set up the admissions, membership, and raffle areas. This work starts at 11 AM and we need as many people as possible. Even if you can only come for an hour around 11 AM, that would help. Judy is providing lunch to all of you who come to help set up. Your show chair is taking many unpaid days off from work in January to organize the show. It

would be great if some of you young, strong types would consider taking a half-day off work to help with set-up.

**ADMISSIONS:** This job requires you to greet the guests, take their "donation" and keep track of how they heard about the show. It is a sit-down, social job.

**MEMBERSHIP AND RAFFLE TABLES:** This is also a sit-down, social job. You tell people about our meetings and events, sign up new members and take member renewals. You sell the raffle tickets, and hand out culture sheets and invitations to our meetings. All sounds pretty easy, huh?

**SECURITY:** This is a stand-up, social job. It is important to everyone that the plants in the show display area are not disturbed and we don't want any plants to enter or leave the display area. We need volunteers to keep a watchful eye on this area. Also, food and open drinks are not allowed in the display room. Volunteers in this area also get to talk to our guests and talk about orchids, what else? It's easy and it's fun.

**PLANT HOTEL:** This is a stand-up and sit-down social job. The hotel is where the visitors can keep their plants while they continue to enjoy the show and sales area. There is no charge to the guests and the job requires taking their plants, putting them in a box with their name on it, and giving them back when they return to leave. Again, you will get to talk to people and have fun.

**TAKE DOWN:** On Sunday, at 5:00 PM we need help with the take-down. This requires volunteers to help with security, keeping an eye on the front doors as people leave. We also need volunteers to help take down what we put up on Friday, and load the vehicles that will be taking our "stuff" back to the storage facility.

## Calling All Novice Exhibitors!

The success of the show depends on everyone entering their orchids to make a spectacular first impression for people visiting the show.

The Novice Division is the smallest division every year. How often people arrive at the show on Saturday and wish they had entered too! Your plants could be on the bench, winning ribbons and admired by the crowds!

Give it a try - brighten up your January! All you need is an orchid with these attributes:

- It is in flower
- It is free of pests and disease
- It does not need a name tag! We will help you get it into the right class.
- If you have owned the plant for fewer than 6 months, it will be eligible for AOS and CSA judging but not for POS ribbon awards. To be eligible for ribbon awards, plants must have been owned by the entrant for at least 6 months.

Start planning your entries now! If you think you might enter a plant, stake it as it is coming into spike, if it needs to be staked. Clean the leaves with water, or 50/50 water and skim milk, or lemon juice. The skim milk and the lemon juice are helpful in removing hard water deposits. Set your plant in a pot that does not draw attention away from the flowers. Dress up the planting media top with moss, hiding the growing pot, if you like. Michaels is an excellent source of inexpensive plain decorative pots and moss as well as green coated wire to support delicate inflorescences. If your plant needs to be hung, you will need to supply a fixture to hang it from. Small hanging plants can be hung from clear or solid color vases. Pendulous orchids will need something to stand on. # Be a Ribbon Judge

Friday night of our show, we will need a host of ribbon judges. This is one of the most **fun**, I cannot stress this enough, and interesting jobs at the show. You will be placed on a team, headed by an AOS judge or judge in training, given a list of classes to judge, then head out, find your plants and select the winners. At the end of the judging, everyone gets to vote on the overall winners. Don't miss out on this great opportunity!! Just show up no later than 6:45 on Friday, January 24th.

#### **Member Sales**

Members are invited to bring plants to sell at the show. The POS will handle the sale and keep 25% of the sale price. Members can bring up to 50 plants to sell and all plants should be in good condition and free of pests and disease. Plants can be brought to the Community Activities Building between 2 and 6PM on Friday, January 24th. Each plant must be labeled with a corresponding tear off label and a list of all plants submitted must be provided.


## **Author Signing!**


Mary Gerritsen and Ron Parsons will be selling copies of their new books at the February POS meeting, and possibly (if the books are here!) at the POS show. The books are entitled, A *Compendium of Miniature Orchid Species*, Volume 1 and 2.

Here is little information about the books from the Red Fern Natural History Productions Web Site.

The two volume work features individual entries for over 500 miniature orchids species across 120 different genera, presented in an encyclopedic format. Richly illustrated with over 1800 spectacular photographs of orchids in culture and in the wild (many of which are plants of SFOS members!), each species entry includes nomenclatural and etymological information, as well as detailed and specific cultivation guidance and notes about habitat, conservation status and similarities to other orchids. The species entries also incorporate newly published taxonomic data that is also reflected in the extensive cross-index of orchid names and synonyms, and all species are generously represented with numerous photographs, including images of other species with which they are easily confused.

The discounted price will be \$140 for the 2 volumes, and they can be autographed if desired. This price is a savings of \$20 to \$40-depending on where you get them from taxes and shipping costs.
