

### Volunteer at POE

Now that I've thanked you for volunteering and making our show a success, I'm going to ask that you do it again at the Pacific Orchid Exposition (POE). The POE is one of the very few remaining large orchid shows in the country and needs volunteers to continue. Here is a message from Mary Gerritsen, who, in addition to being a past president of the POS, frequent attendant at meetings, and famous author (see below), is the President of the San Francisco Orchid Society, which puts on the POE:

I am writing to ask for you help at the Pacific Orchid Exposition. This year for some reason, we seem to be very short of volunteers, and are expecting one of the biggest shows ever! I am writing to *BEG* you to come to our help! If you volunteer for a 3 hour shift, you will get a badge that gives you unlimited entry to the show for all three days (Feb 21-23). We have nearly sixty vendors this year, a number of them brand new to the show. The choice of plants for sale and on display should be outstanding.

The following volunteer opportunities are available; each shift is about 3 hrs. Please let me know what you would like to do and then I will follow up with more information.

# Hospitality: 2 types of jobs. Opportunities available on Friday, Feb 21. Also at lunchtime on Saturday Feb 22 and Sunday Feb 23.

Shifts 9-12, 12-3 and 3-6

<u>Break Area:</u> Setting up and maintaining area. Includes making coffee (heavy lifting), and distributing lunches. This is mostly a sit down job other than making the coffee. It is possible that you can get someone to help you with the coffee if the lifting is an issue.

<u>Vendor Support:</u> Providing breaks for vendors who are alone; distributing water and fruit; overseeing "proof of sale dots". This is a walk around the sales area type of position-very social!

### Security:

Three types of jobs:

- 1. <u>Sitting/Standing in the area between the sales and vendor area.</u> Making sure that plants purchased in the sales area do not go into display area. Directing people to store them at the plant hotel, or directing them to the exits.
- 2. <u>Standing/sitting at the exits and checking plants purchased for "proof of sale dots".</u> Plants without dots are not allowed out of the building. People are directed back to the vendor to get dots.
- 3. <u>Walking around the display area keeping an eye on the plants.</u> Asking people not to touch the plants. Last year we had some valuable plants stolen from the display area, so we want to keep a closer eye on them this year. If there is a problem, you can contact the head of security for help. (Head of security will help with any issues that might come up).

Shifts are morning, mid day and late afternoon. Help is particularly needed on Friday (any of the shifts), and on Sunday afternoon (2:30-5:30 pm).

### **Plant Hotel:**

Available shifts: Friday 3-6 and Saturday 3-6

Job: Accepting plants from people who are checking them in for safekeeping. Putting the plants in the box. Giving the person a ticket for the plants and putting the matching ticket on the plants. Placing the plants in the box on a shelf. Retrieving plants from shelves in exchange for the matching tickets. Job involves standing, walking around, some lifting. Some of the cymbidiums are heavy, but you can always ask one of the other plant hotel people for help if they are too heavy.

If you are interested in volunteering, please let me know what day(s) and what jobs interest you the most. It would be good to provide a second choice should your first one no longer be available!



### Gerardus Staal, PhD Peninsula Orchid Society President 1981

Gerardus Staal, our President in 1981 and holder of various offices in POS "since the mind of man remembereth not," passed away on Monday 10 February. Gerardus received his doctorate from the Netherlands Institute of Plant Sciences at Wageningen and was immediately engaged for research into tropical crop management in the former Dutch East Indies. He spent much time at Buitenzorg, now Bogor, the most illustrious research garden within the tropics, and his

leisure-time collections of endemic club mosses of Indonesia are definitive. He and wife Mary came to the United States where he was employed by Zoecon, the research entomologists in Palo Alto, and he is named on the patents for Enstar, Talstar and derivative instar-inhibiting insecticides and acaricides.

Gerardus took an interest in orchids as the most highly-evolved form of plant life and commenced growing them at home in Palo Alto, eventually building a very large greenhouse for his collection, which not unerringly tended towards cool-growing genera. For several decades Gerardus played with hybridizing the orchids in the greenhouse, the result being rather speculative crosses. Since growing the seedlings on to blooming size necessitated more bench space than he had available, Gerardus had the inspiration of selling the seedlings in flask, and having others grow them and bloom them. This enterprise carried on until two years ago under the name Peninsula Hybrids. Gerardus exercised his occasional droit de seigneur by naming the resulting hybrids for acquaintances, many of them POS members: Epidendrum Ross Newman (falcatum x parkinsonianum), Severinara Lil, Roccaforteara Stella, which survive in our own greenhouses. He sold his orchids in 2012, as they stood in the way of a new home for the Staals in retirement.

On many occasions, Gerardus was speaker at POS, most famously in review of pesticides, fungicides and bactericides, our own resource that many another society coveted. He served POS in many capacities over the years, most memorably as registrar of entries at all POS shows since 1979. Mary, for her part, sold raffle tickets at the back of our meeting room, which place is still reserved for her.
