

Peninsula Orchid Society San Mateo, CA Vol. 2 of 2015

Next Meeting of Peninsula Orchid Society is Feb 27 at 605 Parkside Way, San Mateo, CA 94403. Doors open at 7:00 p.m. with meeting at 7:30.

Our featured speaker for the February meeting is our longtime member, Paul Chim, an esteemed and well-known grower and breeder of Cymbidiums and other genera of orchids.

Paul is taking a 12 day trip to China during the first half of February. We will enjoy a fresh travelogue of this trip, which will include pictures of the part of China explored and orchids plus possibly other plants found there. Paul will give us pointers on Cymbidium culture and show us photos of his awarded Cymbidiums from the last two years.

Paul's specialty is growing cool-growing species and hybrid Cymbidiums. He has been growing orchids for over 40 years. Paul is a former president and vice president of the California Orchid Society, and member or officer of San Francisco Orchid Society, Marin Orchid Society, and is a founding member of the Golden Gate Cymbidium Society. (Chaunie wonders how he avoided serving on the board of the Peninsula Orchid Society.)

Paul and his wife, Phyllis occasionally have an orchid open house at their home in San Leandro, where you may learn additional details about growing specific plants of his.

Paul has always been very generous with his support of the local orchid scene. He was

kind enough to volunteer several plants for our January show. He is providing this month's opportunity table plants. His Cymbidium Kelley's Winter won the class for Best Open Cymbidium at our show. Paul and his wife, Phyllis volunteered both Saturday and Sunday at our January Show.

Spring Greenhouse Bus Tour! The spring bus tour will be a joint tour with the Santa Clara Orchid Society. Lunch will be provided and we'll visit Bay Breeze Orchid Nursery, Matsui Orchids, Orchid Zone, Passagno Winery (which would require a \$10 tasting charge if you are planning to taste wines), and if time should allow, South Pacific Orchids. Bring boxes! The bus will depart at 9:00 a.m. sharp. Check out your navigating device ahead of time, if you'll depend on it to get you to the boarding site.

We'll board starting before 8:45 at the Light Rail Station at the Corner of Curtner and Canoas Garden. Chaunie notes that the Google map is a bit off; the station is right at the noted corner. For those coming from the north, take 280 to 87 south to Curtner and then turn right.

We should return around 4:30 p.m.



The small stainless steel clippers are still available to members who renew before the March meeting, and to new members for 2015. Barry Zimmerman would like to caution us that you could melt the tiny tips of these clippers in a very hot torch flame (near the tip of the inner cone of the flame), for some areas of the flame are hotter than the melting point of the stainless steel alloy used to make these little gems, so you'd rapidly lose the utility of these clippers. I add that the stainless grade used to fab these is not temperable, so you need not quench them (I do to quickly cool them.), and as long as you don't heat them past a dull red glow, they'll not be degraded.
