

Hanging Gardens: Worts and All

Every growing environment has its microclimates. By developing an understanding of the conditions in different parts of the growing area, we can position individual plants where they have the best chance to flourish. Sounds simple, but in practice, the process is more complicated. It involves a lot of trial and error, ongoing observation of results, and the willingness to make changes when needed - the last part being maybe the hardest!

After 12 years in my current greenhouse, I've made progress in some areas, but fallen behind in others. Whoever said orchids thrive on neglect must have been growing the plastic kind! The presentation will offer a look at different environments in the greenhouse and some of the things that grow there, with a candid discussion of what works and what doesn't. We'll also look at some of the dilemmas encountered in the continuing effort to become a better grower (or at least not a worse one).

Dan Newman started growing orchids in 1982. His first successful subject was a Dendrobium hybrid bought as a tiny seedling at a lei stand in the Honolulu Airport. When that plant finally grew up and bloomed a few years later, he was hooked! By 1996 he had 350 orchids in a one-

bedroom apartment. That year he moved his plants into a rented commercial greenhouse in San Francisco. He took over the large species collection of his friend and orchid mentor, Walter Teague, and his hobby evolved into his nursery, Hanging Gardens. Dan started growing orchids full-time in 2000, and moved to a larger greenhouse in Pacifica a few years later. He currently has 12,000 to 15,000 plants, mostly cool to intermediate growers (it's expensive to maintain really warm conditions in Pacifica). This number includes a few hybrids, but species make up his core collection and most of his sale stock.


He also grows a variety of "companion plants", which share the natural habitats of orchids.

Dan is a long time POS member and shared his seemingly infinite knowledge as he introduced our Show & Tell Table at many meetings. He is also past president of the San Francisco Orchid Society. In recent years, he has spoken on a variety of topics to orchid societies in California and elsewhere.

Dan will offer the Opportunity Table at this meeting.

MEMBER NEWS



Fred Shull

Fred Shull passed away in late April after several years' decline in health. His death leaves us with few indeed of the patriarchs of Bay Area orchid growing from the 1970s. Fred will be remembered even by those who did not know him, by his formidable Yosemite Sam mustache as much as by the Cattleyas and Laelias he brought to our show and tell table each month. Other POS members knew him as our best-dressed member, an artifact of his career as CFO of the Rochester clothing chain.

Fred grew up in post-war San Fernando Valley, self-immersed in plant growing; by the mid-1950s to the dismay of his parents he had discovered orchids, had joined the Orchid Society of Southern California, and had started a collection of Cattleya hybrids – for the parents to take care of. At the end of the decade he had served out his time in the Air Force and could take charge of his plants himself. They came with him to San Francisco during the '60s, and at least a few survived within the memory of this writer.

Fred was part of the circle of orchid bachelors who made lively the '70s social scene in Bay Area orchid societies. He was President of the San Francisco society, but never of our own, though he considered us his home club because of location of his plants. He discovered the native orchids of Brazil, and made countless journeys there to attend the great Laelia purpurata shows of the Brazilian springtime, and brought back plants, mostly seedlings, of what he liked best. His tag name was Rio Orchids, and eventually he went quasi-commercial (with partner) in Allendale Orchids, an enterprise that

outlived IRS' recognition of its losses... we are told that no plant there deserved the ignominy of being placed in commerce.

Fred became an AOS judge in the 1980s, and was regularly seen at the shows in Northern California.

Many of our members collect famous orchids. Fred collected famous orchid greenhouses. He started with the real estate surrounding the 1920s Lord and Burnham that was part of the E W McLellan estate in Burlingame, in which brothers Edgar and Roderick learned to grow plants; this had also been the property of POS member Robert McElderry. Fred added to this greenhouse, as had Bob. Eventually Fred traded up to the former home of Dr C W Wilson in San Leandro. This included some six commercial-sized greenhouses plus potting sheds from which POS members Jack and Elaine Wilson conducted their own nursery-with-florist enterprise in the 1950s and '60s.

Even all of Fred's orchid plants failed to fill these houses, and there was space to spare for adding Cymbidiums to the mix under influence of Ken Jacobsen. Fred's disposable time in recent years went towards rehabilitation of the Wilson house, and he returned it to its former style as the showplace of San Leandro.

Fred continued attendance at POS meetings until the past year, bringing cars full of Cattleya and Laelia species and hybrids for our show and tell table. Most of these had multiple blooming growths and many were growing in 14- or 16- inch diameter pots. Fred was last seen at our auction in September.


