Editor's Notes



I was happy to see one of those charming rupiculous laelias on our table last month. I'm very fond of these orchids, as well as the small Tolumnias that Eric Levenson sometimes brings in, and I wanted to know how he grows them in our area (and without a greenhouse). He was kind enough to pen the following for us:

Have you shared my orchid growing experience of successfully growing a particular species for 2 or 3 years only to find that you "did something wrong" and killed the plant despite faithful and consistent culture?

This has happened to me several times and I've become a true believer that for many species, when you repot and what media you use can be critical (just as wiser growers have reminded me). This has led me to favor genera and species that don't need to be repotted often due to deteriorating media. Especially favored by me are genera and species that grow in nothing but rocks. Two of such genera that I have grown successfully (so far) are some of the Rupiculous laelias, Hadrolaelias, and Tolumnias.

I'm not experienced enough to give firm advice on how to grow these plants, but I can tell you what has worked for me under the inflexible conditions I have in Los Altos.

First inflexibility, the microclimate ... in Los Altos, where I live, several years of tracking temperatures shows routine summer temps between 90-100F, and not infrequently over 100F; and winter lows often between 30-40F. Usually temperatures are idyllic in Los Altos, but not always.

Second inflexibility, I have no greenhouse so all my plants rotate between in-doors under lights in winter, and outside in a shade house in the summer. So it is a great relief to find beautiful orchids that are happy growing in rocks, rarely requiring repotting, and can stay outside most of the year tolerating these temperature extremes. Tolumnias and Rupiculous laelias, including L. briegeri, L. milleri and L. forneri that I grow, seem to be happy growing this way in Los Altos. Some of the Hadrolaelias I grow also seem happy including Laelia sincorana and L. jongheana.

My Tolumnias, Rupiculous laelias and the Hadrolaelias mentioned above grow in 100% lava stones about ¹/₄" in size over 1 or 2 styrofoam peanuts in clay pots. In summer I water these plants every 2-3 days with rain water and occasional weak fertilizer ... more often if temps soar. And I don't hesitate to mist them. I continue that treatment until temps drop below the low 40's when I bring them inside under lights and reduce water to about every 5-6 days until temps once again rise over about 40F.
