Speaker: Fred Clarke of Sunset Valley Orchids

Topic: "Today's Mini and Compact Cattleyas"

Today Mini and Compact growing Cattleya's come in many colors and shapes. Learn about the small growing Cattleya species, the important breeding plants and what hybrids are available for the orchid enthusiast. In conclusion we cover the 'best practices' for growing these little gems. This is a PowerPoint presentation.

Fred Clarke has been growing orchids for 33 years and has been hybridizing for 25 of those years. With over 25 years as a professional grower and manager in the horticultural industry, Fred applies these skills at his orchid nursery; Sunset Valley Orchids, located in San Diego, California.

He is a passionate orchid grower whose curiosity in orchids is broad and varied. Although developing Cattleya hybrids has been his sustaining interest, he is also actively creating new *Bulbophyllum* and *Paphiopedilum* hybrids.

His pioneering work in *Catasetum* intergeneric hybrids led to the development of several notable hybrids, most recently the grex, *Fredclarkeara After Dark*, which produced "the blackest flower ever witnessed". This grex has received eight FCC's, four AM's and the coveted 'Award of Distinction' on the first flowers shown for judging!

Fred is an Accredited Judge in the Pacific South Judging Region. His plants have received hundreds

of quality awards from the American Orchid Society.

Our show was a success as a fund raiser, but not all that I had hoped as a show due to lack of plant entries. I did hear someone walk into the show room and say "Oh, this is heaven!". Our show was beautiful, but the bench areas were very sparse. People brought in orchids Saturday and Sunday to fill the spaces. The question is, why don't we have more of our members participating in the show itself? If it is truly due to nothing being in bloom, then we need to move our show date. June or August would be great months to have our show. If the entry times don't work for you - bring it up. We make changes to the show every year. One of the functions of the show committee is to solve problems and so make the show evolve. Some other reason, how about cluing me in? We need your entries!

And now the commercial:

Next year we will have a new show chair. Will it be you?

The show is important to our society for many reasons. It gives us time to actually get to know the other members of our society. It gives us goals to work on for our orchid culture and inspires us to work harder to

learn more about the orchids in our individual collections. We have the satisfaction of working as a team at volunteer jobs that we chose. It showcases our society to draw in new members. It provides education about orchids for members of the general public. We get a chance to buy orchids and to find new homes for our divisions. And we generate money needed to pay our society's expenses. The show committee members have considered that we could all just donate \$400 instead of all of the hours we put in, but the show means so much more than just income.

Qualifications:

- Ideally you will want to have worked in several areas during past shows and possibly been the chair for an area or two.
- You will have a hundred to two hundred hours to spend during the six months prior to the show. (If you are really good you will delegate those time consuming organizing tasks and spend about 40 hours working on the show.)
- You do NOT need to be any kind of orchid expert. This job falls more under the umbrella of event organizer than orchid expert.
- You do not need to figure out everything about the show. Many people will help you who have years of experience running pieces of the show.
- You want to see a beautiful show and a fun sale take place.

Whoever you are, 2020 POS Show Chair, the sooner you step up to take this on, the easier the job will be. Just let Eric Levenson know that you are interested in chairing the next show!

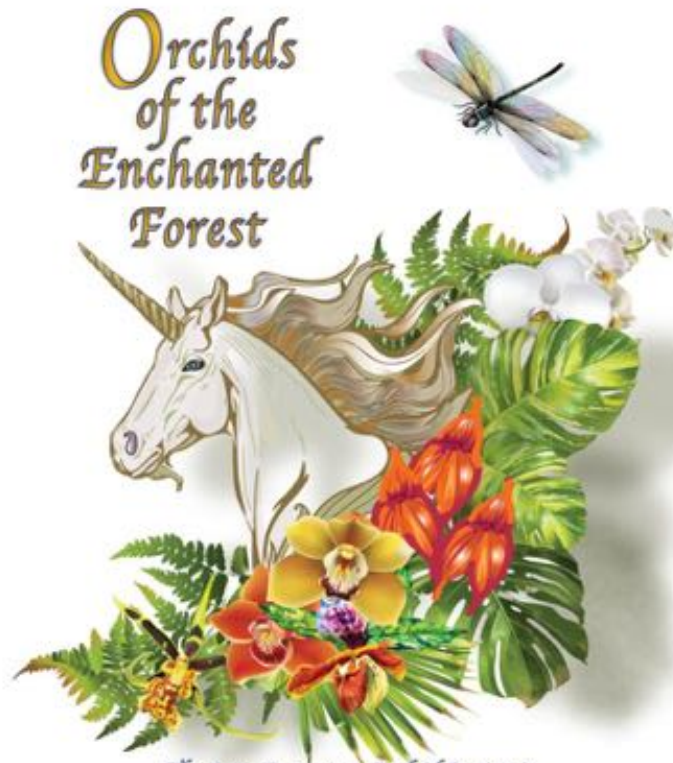
