PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I want to start with a big thank you to everyone that responded to last month's cry for help. The success and continuation of the society relies on the support and participation of all of the members.

To report on the progress we have made so far:

- Trophies: After much discussion and debate, we will not be moving to individual trophies, instead we will go back to an old practice; winners of the trophies, will be allowed to take the trophy home with them for the year.
- Lights: The lights used for the Redwood City shows will be retained.
- Storage: The storage room will be cleaned out and items no longer of use will be removed. We are still looking at moving the storage to a cheaper location.
 Though cheaper options will not have drive up access like the current location.
- Shows: We are definitely having a show and sale on October 12-13th at the San Mateo Garden center. The potential for January shows in Redwood City remains open, and a Show Chair for a potential show would need to step up quickly and begin planning that.
- Budget: We will prepare and publish a budget for next year in the next newsletter.

Regarding the show, now is the time to begin going through your collection, grooming plants for display and selecting plants for sale at the member sales table. I have two giant donated Cymbidiums (each in I'm guessing 15-20gallon pots) that need to be divided and repotted. Anyone that wants to come over and help out there would be very welcome. Member sales are the main way that the society makes money from these events. So I strongly encourage you to divide and repot plants that can be safely repotted now and free up some space in your collection for the member sales table. You can even donate the plants to the Society to sell on the table.

Finally, while the society does not rely on donations to keep operating, we are a registered 501(c)(3) charity and donations are both gratefully accepted and tax deductible in the United States.

ORCHID TALK

Tanya Lam is juggling every day to work full time, travel frequently for business, take care of family and her orchid collections. She lives in San Jose, California where she grows many orchid genera both outdoors and in greenhouses.
